GPA, language proficiency etc.)	The official TOPIK (Test of Proficiency in Korean Language) score is NOT required, but, if possible, we prefer prospective students to have at least basic or intermediate communicative skills in Korean, because the medium of language for most of the courses here at BUFS is Korean. Korean skill courses focusing on communicative skills are offered for the international students and there are also several content-based courses in English, but the majority of courses are delivered in Korean.
19. In case of language proficiency requirements, have our exchange students mandatory to provide any kind of language certification? If yes, which one?	There is no required language certification, BUT since most of the courses are offered in Korean, the students need to have a basic skill in Korean language.
20. Main language of instruction:	Korean
21. Others languages of instruction:	A few classes are offered in English, but it is very limited. The International College offers academic courses in English but a majority of courses are offered in Korean.
22. Which department and lessons can our exchange students access to? Can they take classes from different departments?	<p>Exchange students will be placed in courses exclusively for international students within the Division of International Studies (Korean Language & Culture Track). These courses, which may include functional and skill-based classes to improve Korean language proficiency, and liberal arts subjects, are separate from those taken by local Korean students majoring in Korean Language and Literature.</p> <p>However, for international students whose Korean language competency is above par, he/she can choose to take content-based courses with the local Korean students.</p>
23. Are there any departments/courses not open to our exchange students?	Technically, undergraduate level courses are open, although there may be some exception, to all international students, on condition that the exchange students have a Korean language proficiency to compete with the local Korean students.
24. Could you explain us your grading system in full?	The duration of "one semester" is typically 15 weeks, and the number of credits assigned for each courses is "usually" based on the number of class hours per week for the duration of one semester. For example, if you are taking a 3 credit course, this means the class on average meets 3 hours per week for 15 weeks. Therefore, "a 3 credit course" is equivalent of about 45 hours.

It is essential that your private insurance remains valid for the entire duration of your study period.</p> <p>Purchasing a private plan is a crucial step to complement the mandatory National Health Insurance in Korea (NHIK). Your private insurance will cover areas not addressed by the NHIK, such as repatriation and medical evacuation. Furthermore, it ensures there is no gap in your coverage, as the NHIK may not become effective until a couple of months after your arrival. This dual approach guarantees you have comprehensive health and safety coverage throughout your stay in Korea.</p>

Courses

Information about courses changes every semester, so please check our website regularly.
Major students have the first opportunity to register for their major courses during the Course Registration Period. The English-taught courses List will be confirmed for next semester in early February / August. Please refer to the course list from the previous corresponding semester. [2025 course list : Link](#)

All students register for courses through the online course registration system at the same time, so it may be competitive to get a spot in some courses. We recommend that students discuss with the Coordinator at their home university to prepare several options in advance for registration.

Korean Language Courses

- ♦ We offer free Korean language courses to exchange students(only Undergraduate/ Credits given).
- ♦ The Korean-level test will be taken before the semester.

Credit Load

All exchange students have to take at least one class. Undergraduate students are allowed to take up to 18 credits per semester. Graduate students are allowed to take up to 9 credits per semester.

Most classes are 3 hours per week, which means three credits per class.

Visa information

- ♦ Exchange and Visiting students studying in Korea should hold an **Exchange student visa (D-2-6) or a Visiting student visa(D-2-8)** before arrival, which can be applied for and obtained at your country's nearest Korean Embassy or Consulate. [Link](#)
- ♦ When applying, students must submit the “**Certificate of Admission**”, which will be officially issued by Incheon National University.
- ♦ Please consult your local Korean Embassy regarding other required documents for your visa application.
- ♦ Check the [e-Government website](#) for Foreigners.

Residency Card Registration

- ♦ You will receive more information about the process at the **International Students Orientation**.
- ♦ **The International office will accompany you** to the Immigration office for a Residency Card.
- ♦ Within 90 days of your arrival in Korea, you **must** go to the Immigration Office to register and get a Certificate of Residency Card, regardless of your visa type.

(After arriving in Korea, you must not leave Korea before a Residency Card is issued.)

Health Insurance

All international students will be automatically enrolled in the National Health Insurance. (Average Monthly Insurance Fee (for 2025): Approx. 75,000 KRW.) and from the date of the alien registration card. Before that, your international health insurance should cover all medical costs. Students have to subscribe in advance to personal insurance valid for 2 to 3 months from the moment of arrival to Korea.

Please be aware that for all international students, **purchasing Private International Insurance is Mandatory** because of **the gap in NHIS's effect**. This private insurance covers international students' accidents and sicknesses until National Health Insurance(NHIS) takes effect, which is much broader than NHIS.(Ex. in case of an Operation, etc.) You can purchase International Insurance from your home country, OR Insurance from a Korean private company; we will provide information. The students will be responsible for addressing their travel abroad needs. Please check the details on our website, [Health Insurance](#).

On-Campus Dormitory (type and fees):

- Meals are not included
- Utility fees and facility deposit are included
- Blankets and pillows are not provided in a room, so you should purchase them individually.
- Students must submit the **Tuberculosis test result** (Only an X-ray with a doctor's note, only two months before the check-in date is valid.) **and a Certificate of Measles Vaccination** (at least once) on move-in day. Without the document, you are not allowed to check in. The TB test should be taken within two months before the check-in date.

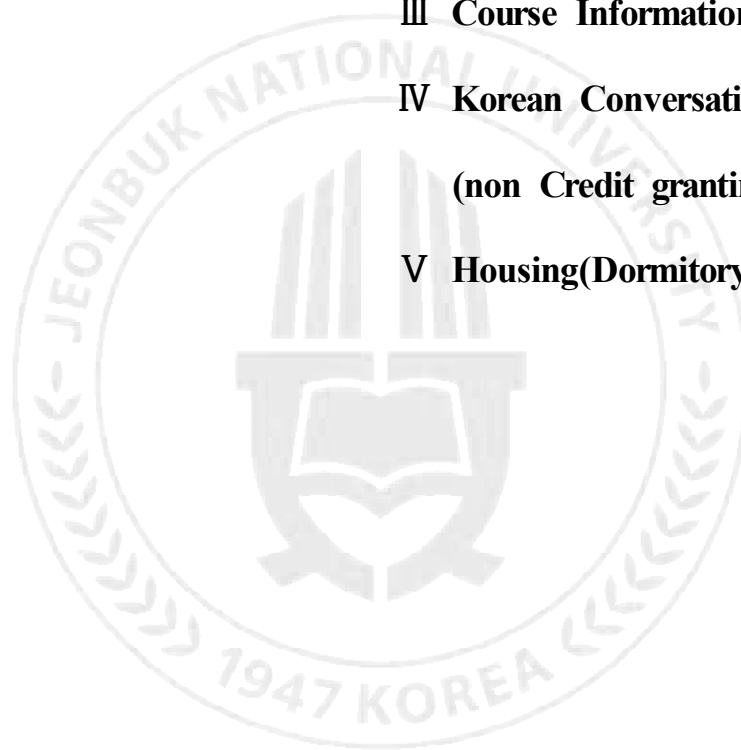
