GPA, language proficiency etc.)	<p>Yes, the requirements depend on the program.</p> <p>In general, exchange students should have a good academic standing at their home university and an adequate level of language proficiency (usually in French or English, depending on the courses they choose).</p> <p>Some departments may have additional requirements related to specific subjects or prerequisites.</p>

Yes, exchange students must have valid health insurance covering their stay in Tunisia. It can be international insurance from their home country or local coverage upon arrival.
34. If yes, can you give us more details about it and the average cost?	Yes, students must have health insurance that covers medical expenses during their stay in Tunisia. They can either use international insurance from their home country or subscribe to a local one. The average cost for local insurance is around 20 to 30 euros per month .
