The minimum grade required to pass is three point zero (3.0). Additionally, in the certificate you can find the following abbreviations: AP = Approved, NA = Not Approved, and PD – Pending of Approval.</p> <p>For the Universidad Nacional de Colombia the credit is the measuring unit of the time a student requires for the satisfactory accomplishment of each subject's training purposes and it is equivalent to 48 work hours, including house work, of the student in one academic period.</p>
